Rules and Regulations For the Use of Lake Lackawanna Facilities

INTRODUCTION

The rules, regulations and definitions listed on this and the following pages are designed to provide the membership with proper expectations for conduct that should enhance the living quality of the Lake Lackawanna Community. The Lake Lackawanna Investment Company (LLIC) reviews all rules and regulations for continued relevancy each year. Your full cooperation in observing these rules is expected. Violation of these rules could result in forfeiture of membership privileges.

Fully paid members are able to enjoy all that LLIC has to offer, including:

- Use of all LLIC facilities including the Lake, Beach, Club House, and 280 wooded acres
- Free swim lessons and water safety class for children
- Boat slip rental
- LLIC Club house rental at a discounted rate

MEMBERSHIP PERIOD

The membership period runs from April 1st through March 31st annually.

MEMBERSHIP CAP

A membership cap of 205 members has been instituted. Once this Membership Cap is reached there will be a waiting list for any new members that wish to join (only residents that are current with their administrative fee are eligible for the waitlist). If you are currently a paid member and selling your home your membership eligibility may be transferred to the new owners of your home if they continue membership without a lapse. If you are not a paid member and the Membership Cap has been reached and you are selling your home, you cannot advertise it as eligible for Lake Membership.

DEFINITIONS

- 1) RESIDENT – principal occupant(s) of the residence (year round or seasonal). The Lake Lackawanna area consists of:

- 2) MEMBERS
 - a) RESIDENT MEMBER – principal occupant(s) of the residence (year round or seasonal) who is a full dues paying member. Members are prohibited from lending their badges to resident non-members.
 - b) OUTSIDE MEMBERSHIPS – There may be limited memberships available for families residing outside of the LLIC area. Each applicant for outside membership must be reviewed and approved by the LLIC Board of Directors. Boating rights for outside members will be determined by the LLIC Board of Directors. **The Board reserves the right to limit the number of outside memberships.** The Outside Membership fee will be established on an annual basis by the LLIC Board of Directors.
 - c) COMMERCIAL MEMBERSHIPS – Commercial memberships are available at the discretion of the LLIC Board of Directors, each applicant must be reviewed and approved by the LLIC Board of Directors.
- 3) RESIDENT NON-MEMBER – principal occupant(s) of the residence (year round or seasonal) who has chosen not to join and pay for a FULL membership. All residents must pay the yearly administrative fee and the dredging assessment.

Resident Non-Member Privileges

- a) **No use** of any LLIC operated facilities.
 - b) Rental of the LLIC Club House at **full fee**.
 - c) Lakefront property owners who are non-members **may not** have docks.
 - d) ***Resident non-members violating these rules and regulations are subject to trespassing laws.***
- 4) **GUEST** – any person(s) residing outside of the LLIC membership area who are visiting Residents.
- a) Guests of Members are defined as any person(s) residing outside of the LLIC membership area who are invited by LLIC members to use our facilities on an infrequent, sporadic, temporary or short-term basis.
 - i) Infrequent or sporadic use is defined as no more than one use per week each week (with a maximum of 10 uses within one season) regardless of which member the guest is with.
 - ii) Temporary or short-term basis is defined as friends/relatives visiting a resident member for no more than a total of 14 days within one season.
 - iii) Non-residents who wish to use LLIC facilities on a more frequent or prolonged basis may apply for purchase of an outside membership as described in 2(b) above subject to Board approval.
 - iv) Guests of members invited to utilize our beach must arrive and depart from the beach with a member.
 - v) All guests of members must have a badge with them.
 - b) Guests of Members are not customers, renters, or any party that pays compensation to a resident member for occupancy, except that a long-term renter (renting 12 months or more consecutively) shall be permitted to file an application for membership as a resident member.
 - i) All renters other than long-term renters are prohibited from using any LLIC facilities.
 - c) Guests of Resident Non-Members may **NOT** use any LLIC operated facilities.
 - d) LLIC reserves the right to curtail excessive beach visits by non-relative guests. All members and guests are expected to register with the lifeguard when arriving at the beach during periods when a lifeguard is on duty.
- 5) **CAREGIVERS:**
- a) This applies to members caring for non-resident children and non-members caring for resident-member children.
 - b) Caregiver memberships may be purchased at designated fees to be determined by the LLIC Board of Directors. All individuals with “Caregiver or care-receiver” badges may only use the LLIC facilities when accompanied by LLIC members. Other friends or relatives (including caregiver’s own minor-aged children) may not be brought with them. Non-resident caregivers with children above the age of 5 years who wish to also bring their own children to the beach should purchase a full Outside Membership (**subject to LLIC Board approval**).
 - c) Caregiver memberships may be upgraded to full memberships by paying the current difference between full membership and the caregiver membership rate.
- 6) **ADMINISTRATIVE FEE** – Effective in 1989, an administrative fee was instituted by LLIC. The *current yearly administrative fee is \$175.00. This fee alone does not afford the use of any LLIC properties. This fee is waived when the full annual membership fee is paid. All residents choosing not to pay the full membership must pay the yearly administrative fee and the dredging assessment. Both these fees will accrue annually and must be paid before membership is permitted.*

General Rules and Regulations
For the Use of
Lake Lackawanna Facilities

BEACH

All activities pertaining to the beach area fall within the control of the Beach Committee of the LLIC Board of Directors. Specific regulations include the following:

- 1) A certified lifeguard will be on duty at the beach as posted.
- 2) Swimming when the lifeguard is off duty is at your own risk.
- 3) Swimming after dusk and before sunrise is prohibited.
- 4) Beach area is off limits after dusk. Unless otherwise previously authorized, persons found in this area are trespassing.
- 5) LLIC badges must be in your possession at all times or you can be told to leave.
- 6) Members are prohibited from lending their badges to anyone for any purpose.
- 7) Non-Family non-resident guests must arrive and depart with a member. (Refer to guest restrictions listed in 4 a) of Definitions.) *Members with non-resident relative guests may contact a member of the Beach Committee to obtain approval for unaccompanied visits.*
- 8) Children under **12** years of age cannot enter beach area without a member 18 years of age or older who will be responsible for the safety and supervision of those children. Children under **12** years of age must leave the beach area when their adult guardian leaves.
- 9) Children **12** years of age and older who demonstrate an inability to swim competently, endangering the safety or well being of others, or engaging in improper conduct will, at the discretion of the lifeguard, be asked to leave the beach area. This individual may not return without a parent or legal guardian.
- 10) No swimming alone when a lifeguard is off duty. When swimming without a lifeguard on duty, children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult. Swimming is at your own risk. The rules for swimming when a lifeguard is off duty are legislated by the government as part of the New Jersey State Recreational Bathing Code.**
- 11) Swimming or playing from the water flow of the dam is prohibited.
- 12) Rafts and floats are allowed in the swimming areas with lifeguard approval, so long as they are not disruptive to others.
- 13) Fishing is prohibited in the beach and dam areas at all times.
- 14) All watercraft is prohibited from encroaching into the posted beach area.
- 15) Glass containers are not permitted in the beach area.
- 16) All trash must be removed and properly disposed of by the member.
- 17) **Smoking at the beach is prohibited.**
- 18) Parking facilities are for resident members and their guests only. No overnight parking is permitted.
- 19) Bicycles must be parked in the designated bike parking area only.
- 20) Members wishing to hold a special function must give 48 hour pre-notification to a Board Beach Committee Chair. Members holding special functions must remove and dispose of all refuse at end of event.**
- 21) Pets are not allowed on the beach or in the beach swimming area at any time.
- 22) Lifeguards and resident members have authority to police beach, swimming, and parking areas.
- 23) Lifeguards and/or LLIC Board Members have the authority to remove anyone from the beach for infraction of rules.
- 24) Lifeguards have the authority to clear the water of all bathers whenever deemed necessary.
- 25) Non-resident relatives of Members can participate in the swim lessons for an additional established fee, if space is available.

ENVIRONMENTAL

All activities pertaining to environmental concerns fall within the control of the Environmental Committee of the LLIC Board of Directors. Specific regulations include the following:

- 1) Dumping on any LLIC property is prohibited and violators are subject to prosecution and immediate loss of membership.
- 2) **DO NOT FEED THE GEESE** as per New Jersey State law (Department of Environmental Protection).
- 3) **Do not blow or rake leaves and grass clippings into any portion of the lake as per Byram Township ordinance.**
- 4) Do not use phosphorus type detergents and lawn fertilizers as they accelerate weed growth in the lake.
- 5) **The LLIC encourages all residents to maintain their septic systems. The township of Byram has enacted septic management rules for Lake Lackawanna households.**
- 6) Please remember Byram Township has an animal waste ordinance in place, and scoop your pets waste when walking them within our community.

CLUBHOUSE

All activities pertaining to the clubhouse fall within the control of the Clubhouse Committee of the LLIC Board of Directors. Specific regulations include the following:

- 1) The Clubhouse is available for rental. Members can rent the LLIC Clubhouse at a discounted rate.
- 2) Rental information regarding use of the Clubhouse may be obtained from the Clubhouse Committee or by leaving a message on the Clubhouse answering machine @ 973-691-1191. A member of the Clubhouse Committee will return your call.
- 3) A rental agreement **MUST** be signed before rental and a security deposit is required.
- 4) All events for those under twenty-one (21) years of age must be chaperoned by an adult who is twenty-one (21) years of age or older. Alcoholic beverages are **NOT** permitted.
- 5) All events where alcoholic beverages are present must comply with all state and local laws referring to the consumption of and serving of alcohol.
- 6) Parking is prohibited on the front lawn of the Clubhouse and is available in the rear or on the side driveways only. Overnight parking is prohibited.
- 7) All trash is to be removed and properly disposed of by the renter.

HUNTING ACTIVITIES

All activities pertaining to hunting fall within the control of the Forestry Committee of the LLIC Board of Directors. Specific regulations include the following:

- 1) Members and their guests have the privilege of hunting on designated LLIC grounds.
- 2) Valid LLIC membership badges along with valid New Jersey hunting licenses must be worn at all times, and clearly visible when hunting on LLIC property.
- 3) Hunting will be regulated by the New Jersey Fish and Game Laws. Additionally, the LLIC Board reserves the right to impose more stringent regulations on its grounds concerning game limits, loaded firearms boundaries, etc., as deemed necessary.
- 4) It is each hunter's personal responsibility to be fully familiar with the State and LLIC laws and regulations regarding this sport. Violators of same will have their hunting privileges immediately revoked.
- 5) Hunting hours: dawn to dusk only.
- 6) No deer drives allowed on LLIC property.

LAKE ACTIVITIES

The LLIC Lake Committee oversees the year-round use of the lake and its supporting properties. Additionally, this committee arranges for and monitors weed control, dam inspection, water lowering and any and all other matters regarding this subject. To assist them in this effort, the following specific rules are in effect.

Boating - General

- 1) Membership dues must be paid in full before any boat of any size can be placed on the lake. LLIC boat stickers will be issued after appropriate documentation is received and fees are paid.
- 2) Before placing any electric or gas powered boat on Lake Lackawanna, paid members must submit the following documents:
 - a) Copy of valid operator's license for each person who will be operating a boat on Lake Lackawanna during current boating season.
 - b) Copy of appropriate State Registration for boat or boats.
 - c) Copy of applicable boat liability and/or homeowner's insurance.
- 3) NJ State law requires that all boat operators born after December 31, 1968 must complete an approved safety course. No person under the age of 13 years shall operate any power vessel and no person under the age of 16 years shall operate a power vessel equipped with a motor of 10 hp or more. **All affected boat operators must present proof of course completion prior to using a power boat on Lake Lackawanna.**
- 4) All boats **of any kind** must display a LLIC boat sticker for the current season on the right hull. Without a sticker displayed, you will be required to remove the boat from the water until this identification is applied.
- 5) Per NJ State law, all boats of any kind or size which are powered by gas or electric motors, must be registered and bear the appropriate State Registration numbers and be operated by licensed operators only.
- 6) State of New Jersey marine rules for motor boats must be observed at all times. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - a) Life jackets sufficient for your boat's capacity must be on board.
 - b) Fire extinguisher on board all gas powered boats.
- 7) The LLIC boat landing ramp, accessible only by purchase of a key, must be kept easily accessible to all members at all times. The chain gate is to be locked after entering and again after leaving.
- 8) All watercraft are prohibited from encroaching into the posted beach area or immediately adjacent to the dam.
- 9) Boats may not be tied to swim area ropes or platforms for any reason.
- 10) Boat trailers, with or without boats on them, may be stored, at the owner's risk, at the landing during the summer and/or winter seasons for the published fee. License plates must be affixed to trailer or plate number must be painted on trailer.
- 11) A limited number of boat slips at the boat landing are available for summer rental to dues-paying members only.
- 12) A limited number of non-powered boats may be left at the boat landing, at the owner's risk, for published fee.

Boating – Safety

- 1) No one shall operate any boat in a reckless or negligent manner, particularly near shorelines and other boats. Powerboat operators shall make every reasonable effort to avoid creating hazards and damage from its boat's wake.
- 2) Speed limit is 35 miles per hour at all times on the lake unless posted otherwise or stated in these rules and regulations.
- 3) Speed limit is 25 miles per hour in the channel between the Bar/Restaurant and Turtle Island.
- 4) All boat traffic in the main sections of the lake must be in a counter clockwise direction.
- 5) Overtaking boats, except in the channel, must pass on the starboard (right) side of the boat being passed.
- 6) No boat shall stop, anchor or drift in the Turtle Island channel, except from sunrise to 8 AM. Boats heading into and through the aforementioned channel will pass in single file to the right of the buoys at all times.
- 7) No wake prior to 8 am and after sunset.
- 8) All boats operated on the lake after sunset must be equipped with proper lights being operated in accordance with current State Marine Laws.
- 9) During flood conditions, NO WAKE is permitted on any part of the lake.

Fishing

- 1) All summer and winter fishing will be regulated by the New Jersey Fish and Game Commission regulations, particularly those regarding size and quantity allowed.
- 2) Members are requested and encouraged to PLEASE adopt the "catch and release" program when fishing to help preserve fish populations.
- 3) Fishing licenses should be displayed in accordance to NJ State Law.
- 4) Only dues-paying members or their non-resident guests are permitted to fish in Lake Lackawanna. This includes Ice Fishing.
- 5) No fishing is permitted in the beach and dam area at any time throughout the year.
- 6) Ice fishing hours are 8 AM to Dusk ONLY.
- 7) Ice fishermen must keep all their equipment within a radius of 25 yards, and more than 75 feet from the shore; and no ice fishing in the coves.
- 8) All fishermen must display current year LLIC membership badges.
- 9) The LLIC Board reserves the right to temporarily ban fishing on the lake should they believe it necessary to save diminishing fish populations.
- 10) No fishing permitted when lake is drawn down.

Water Sports (skiing, tubing, etc.)

- 1) There is no swimming allowed from the boat launch property. All boats operating at towing speeds shall operate in a counter clockwise direction.
- 2) All powerboats towing skiers, tubers, etc. must have at least two persons on board, which include a duly licensed driver and a "spotter" at least 13 years old.
- 3) Any person engaging in a water sport activity must wear an approved, personal flotation device.
- 4) Water sports involving the use of powerboats are permitted between 8:00 AM and sunset only.
- 5) Towlines must not exceed 75 feet in length.
- 6) Ski flags must be prominently displayed on all powerboats when towing.
- 7) Except when landing, boats must remain 75 to 100 feet from the shoreline.
- 8) When traveling through the Turtle Island channel, persons being towed must stay directly behind the boat as it passes to the right of the buoys.
- 9) Boat drivers must slow to a manageable speed when passing through the channel, to assure the persons being towed do not become entangled in the buoys or cross over into the other lane. Speed limit in the channel is 25 MPH.
- 10) Never leave fallen water sport participants unattended any longer than absolutely necessary.
- 11) Skiers dropping one ski for slalom skiing must drop ski out of main boating traffic area.
- 12) Operation of jet skis, wave runners, hydroplanes, or other similar equipment is prohibited on Lake Lackawanna at all times.
- 13) No motorized vehicles are allowed on the ice. This includes all motorized vehicles, such as 3 & 4 wheelers, snow mobiles, etc. Motorized equipment is allowed for the purpose of snow removal only on the ice in front of member's property, at their own risk. Use of motorized equipment for snow removal at the beach is at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Docks

- 1) **Property owners who are not members must remove their existing docks from the lake.**
- 2) All members wishing to install new or replacement docks must submit an application to the LLIC Board of Directors. LLIC will review the application for any potential navigation impact.
- 3) Once LLIC approves the design, the applicant should secure any required permits from Byram Township.

Deicing Systems

- 1) Members installing / operating deicing systems to prevent water from freezing around their docks are responsible for adequately warning members using ice on the lake for recreational purposes of potential open-water and/or thin-ice hazards.
- 2) The open water area created by the deicing system should not extend out more than 5 feet from the owner's shore line or dock area, nor should it extend to adjacent properties.



Membership Application
